SOIL CONSERVATION AND MACHINERY COURSES

Get your roads on the right track, save your soil and bring it back!

Erosion, soil loss and declining productivity are major issues across Central Australia. These problems are wide spread so you may be overwhelmed or find it difficult to know where to begin to rehabilitate degraded areas and prevent problems in the future.

Help is at hand

The Centralian Land Management Association offers Soil Conservation and Machinery courses to help land managers learn best practice techniques in:

- Soil works that prevent erosion
- Correct construction of roads and fencelines
- Rehabilitation of gullies, roads and other erosion problems

The workshops combine hands-on soil erosion control works with accredited machinery training to effectively demonstrate how to rehabilitate degraded areas.

The following activities are covered during the course:

- Construction of diversion / check banks, ripping, win-row removal and land shaping
- Capture and redirection of surface water runoff to return natural drainage lines
- Maintenance of soil stability
- Soil works for natural regeneration of native vegetation

Participants can undertake accredited machinery courses in:

- Skid steer
- Front end loader
- Grader
- Dozer

Participants leave with confidence in rehabilitation and earthworks, practical rehabilitation experience, and receive subsidised Certificates in the machinery of their choice.
